"<u>Walker Hancock</u>. He's the president of one of the longest-standing operations in the world [<u>Claiborne</u> Farm]. He's a high-quality young man, and he's going to do a great job. I respect his family and I respect him."

## Mark Toothaker - Spendthrift Farm



"<u>Liz Crow</u>. She's a relentless worker. She's everywhere. It doesn't matter if it's 5:30 a.m. at Churchill Downs to watch a horse work or walking the barns looking at yearlings – she puts the work in, does her homework, and has a great eye for a runner."

## Carl McEntee - Ballysax Bloodstock



"Phil Hager. I managed David Hager's farm when I was 23 and Phil was a young kid. I've known him since he was 11 or 12. He's a very hard-working young man. He's got a very good eye for a horse. He's just started up his own business, and I think that'll go from strength to strength."

### Scott Mallory - Mallory Farm



"<u>Fletcher Mauk</u> with Small Batch Sales. Fletcher's always had a great eye for a horse. I really respect him when he comes to look at my horses."
